Understand the importance of addressing gender inequalities in post-conflict reconstruction processes.

Discuss the current state of armed conflict and peace and security in the Asia-Pacific region and its impact on women and girls.

Discuss implementation priorities relating to women, peace, and security in the Asia-Pacific region within the framework of UNSCR 1325 (2000) and sister resolutions, with relevant examples.

Understand the roles of the various regional and subregional institutions and mechanisms working on the WPS agenda in the Asia-Pacific.
